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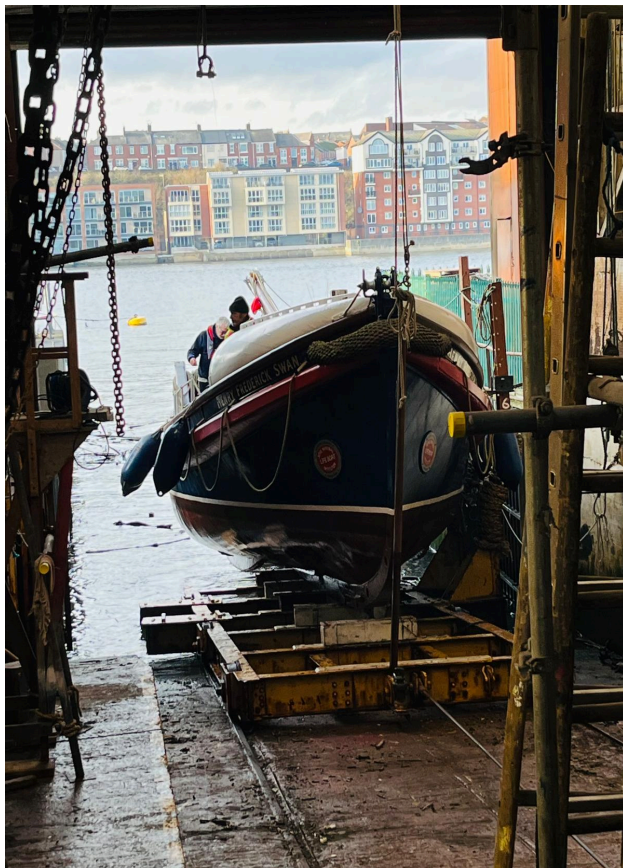
## NEWSLETTER Spring Edition April -2025

## Hartlepool Borough Council

Agreement has been reached to do a full restoration of a historic Hartlepool



Coble called the Friarage. This agreement with the museum and gallery will start with transportation of the vessel around late July/early August. Funding has been secured for a number of years to complete the job jointly with a small number of people who have shown an interest in the boat's future. They will be transported from Hartlepool every week and help with the extensive work involved. It is hoped that they will also look after the vessel when she goes back.

## Golden Gleam-(GG)



We are pleased to say that an agreement has eventually been reached with Northumbrian Fishing Heritage (NFH), formally NFHT, to have the coble Golden Gleam in our main workshop for extensive repairs. This welcome agreement also helps to cover our revenue costs.

Initially for 6 months, then in July she will be transported by whatever means into the Boatshed for completion. This work is being done jointly with NFH and NEMT volunteers.
